Civvies Day tomorrow!

For the privilege and pleasure of wearing “civvies” on Friday, each boy will need to **donate at least R10, ideally from his own pocket money**, to try to accomplish different goals at the various Ivory Park preschools. If a boy wants to contribute more—considering the worthy objectives—that is highly encouraged!! Following is a description of the particular objective for each grade:

Grade 3: The play equipment at Mission House Preschool—much of which Boys’ Prep families donated—needs to be repainted. The staff at Mission House would love to be able to paint all the jungle gyms and swings in bright primary colours. Can Grade 3s help them be able to buy the paint they need?

Grade 4: The kitchen at Nehemiah Preschool does not meet the necessary criteria for getting government certification. The key problem is its location. It is right by the only access point to and from the classrooms. If there were to be a fire in the kitchen, the concern is that the children might be trapped in their classrooms. Can Grade 4s help provide a big financial input to building Nehemiah a new kitchen—in a different place?

Grade 5: Shading in the area between the classrooms is a dream that the staff at Kanana have long had. It would be so helpful to be able to take out the tables and chairs from the classrooms on a sunny day and be able to work and play outside—in shade. Can Grade 5s help make this dream come true?

Grade 6: A generous Grade 6 family (the Grahams) helped provide paving and shading at Phomolong Preschool. However, after the paving was put in, another classroom was added due to increased enrollment (a success!). While this classroom got shading in front of it, it missed out on paving. The staff at Phomolong have longed for paving for the front of this classroom too. Can Grade 6s help make such paving possible?

Grade 7: Klipfontein Preschool is in sad shape, but the kitchen is especially so. The iron sheeting that comprises the kitchen badly needs to be replaced; it is literally disintegrating. The staff at Klipfontein is concerned that the collapsing walls make the electric and gas stoves (which Boys’ Prep provided) easy targets for theft. A new cement slab also needs to be thrown; the holes in the present floor are providing easy access for rats. Can Grade 7s help provide Klipfontein with a new *zozo* and a spanking new cement floor? What a wonderful “farewell” gift that would be from the Grade 7s as they leave Boys’ Prep.

So, instead of having one goal across Boys’ Prep as in previous Civvies Days (such as electric stoves or fire extinguishers), each grade will aim to accomplish objectives specific to the preschool with which they are partnered. Please let us know what you think of this approach. Please also let us know of any ideas for the next Civvies Day.
