In November 2015, the PTAs of the three St Stithians Prep Schools launched a stationery drive in support of the Thandulwazi partner schools. Over the last few months, Michele Strydom, Justine Lacey, Lorna Kirk and Celeste Oates, have coordinated the efforts of a small working group of mothers, fathers and students from the Girls' Prep, Boys' Prep and JP. They have spent long hours cleaning, sorting, sharpening and packing the donated items into 30 beautifully packaged boxes, which were completed yesterday. The boxes of stationery are to be given to partner schools, whose teachers attend the Thandulwazi Teacher Development Programmes in Gauteng and Limpopo. These educators, some of whom come from schools catering for the poorest of the poor, are always so delighted to receive the donated stationery for their students. The Thandulwazi Head (Dr Themba Mthethwa) and programme director (Mrs Ronelle Klinck) will distribute the boxes to selected schools on their visits to the Thandulwazi partner schools later this term.

It is projects such as the Preps Stationery Drive that build collegiality and help to create a community of belonging at St Stithians College.
