In the aftermath of the tragic Michaelhouse bus accident, we have reviewed our existing procedures and added further routine checks and safety instructions, so as to ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to ensure a safe journey.

Arising from our 2053 Landscape Master Plan, we have created new regulations for the walking of dogs on campus. In short, we are requiring dog-walking to happen in the 'veld' areas, on the paths and trails of this zone of the campus: from the dams' area, across the grasslands, and down to the Hurlingham gate. Dog walking is allowed on the ring road from the dams to the Hurlingham gate. We are keeping dogs out of the school precinct and off all field areas. I remind you that dogs are to be kept on leads at all times, and dog-walkers are required visibly to carry their 'permit', obtainable from the Operations Department near the One & All Clubhouse.
