A vibrant and growing community - participates, shares experiences and listens

It is an important feature of our collective DNA that we reflect and listen; we value the opportunity to hear a range of perspectives from staff, students, parents and alumni. By sharing our thoughts, experiences and aspirations we learn and grow. I encourage all in our community to participate, to communicate, to grow your talents and to add your voice — using the many channels and opportunities that are available. I am aware of so many initiatives that represent a healthy and engaged school community. We truly benefit from an active community of belonging.

Human Rights Day

I write this letter on Human Rights Day. We remember the Sharpeville Massacre of 1960 and all other incidents in our more recent past when human dignity has been trampled on and disrespected. Our society experiences daily the testing contradictions between our Constitution's bold affirmation of human rights and lived experiences which deny these rights. At Stithians, we affirm our commitment to fostering individual rights and dignity within our College, with accompanying collective responsibility to promote the embedding of Saints Character: Know Myself, Be Myself, Make My Contribution. At the core of our mission is to educate citizens of our country, continent and globe.

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Transformation and Diversity

The agenda of transformation and diversity is alive and active at St Stithians. During the course of 2017, each school appointed a Director of Transformation and Diversity, who sits on the school executive – and the resulting implementation of intentional and programmatic approaches has reaped much fruit. In the two Colleges, active student committees progress lively and engaged conversations, consciousness-raising and activities. We are, together, on a journey of learning and relationship-building.

Recently, the Campus Transformation Committee (consisting of staff leaders) held a day-long workshop to review the College's <u>Transformation Statement (2009)</u> and the <u>Statement on Race and Racism</u>, <u>Transformation and Diversity (2017)</u>, with the purpose of progressing a new statement of intent and purpose. The meeting concluded that an Anti-Racism Statement be included in the refreshed framework, while also deepening critical engagement with gender discrimination and the promotion of a College culture which embraces diversity in many forms. Refreshing and reaffirming our institutional stance on Transformation and Diversity will involve multiple stakeholders as we engage in deliberation and conversation.

I am keen to grow the identity of St Stithians as a school which connects with the continent of Africa, and graduates alumni who create exciting futures on this continent. Through our affiliation to Round Square, we are growing links with a number of schools in other African countries. In 2015, I began an Africa Reference Group, an informal gathering of parents and staff who have links to African countries north of South Africa. In my bid to revive this group, I issue an invitation to parents and staff to email rector@stithian.com if you wish to participate in the conversations of the Africa Reference Group.

Procurement Policy and Procedures

Our revised and updated procurement policy and procedures are in the final stages of completion. Included in the revision is a more explicit commitment to advancing black economic empowerment (BEE); to creating opportunities for St Stithians parents and alumni to tender for College business; and to communicating more openly on our website about major procurement projects.

We have created a <u>Procurement Page</u> in the Information Section on the College website. Until the new Procurement Policy and Procedures documents are approved by Council, the existing policy frames our approach. We are gearing up to put into practice the intentions of the new procurement processes.

Boys' College Administration Building Upgrade: Pre-Qualification RFI (closing date 5 April 2018)

An important building renovation is planned for the Boys' College Administration Building during 2018. The focus of this is to create a new staffroom, to re-size and modernise eight existing classrooms, and to reconfigure and modernise office spaces. This project will bring disruption to the normal operating of this area of the Boys' College for a number of months.

In the spirit of the new draft Procurement Policy, I bring this project to your attention, and invite construction companies to respond to a Pre-Qualification Request for Information. In response to submissions, the appointed professionals will assist the College management to prepare and select a short-list of appropriate companies to participate in a formal tender process. Administrative notices: College tracksuit, and Closure of Campus offices on 30 April 2018

1. College tracksuit:

According to the College's procedure on changes to the uniform, a two-year notice period is required in the case of major changes to the uniform. During 2015, notice was given of the introduction of a new College tracksuit. I remind all parents and students that, as of January 2018, only the new College tracksuit may be worn for school activities.

2. Campus offices closure on 30 April 2018
