

THANDULWAZI SATURDAY SCHOOL & THANDULWAZI INTERN-TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAMME 2014 ACADEMIC RESULTS

Dear One and All

It gives us great pleasure to share with you the 2014 academic results for the Thandulwazi Saturday School and Thandulwazi Intern Teacher Training Programme.

Thandulwazi Saturday School

The Grade 12 Class of 2014, comprising Matric 222 learners from over 150 Gauteng high schools, achieved an overall pass rate of 94,14%. As in previous years, this overall pass rate is well ahead of both the regional and national pass rates.

Of greater significance, however, is the quality of these results:

- 56,76% of the Thandulwazi students achieved Bachelor Degree (BD) passes (which is double the national BD pass rate).
- The Thandulwazi Matric learners achieved 61 Level 7s (80% and above) in subjects offered by the Thandulwazi Saturday School:
 - 17 distinctions in Core Maths
 - 19 distinctions in Life Science
 - 7 distinctions in Physical Science
 - 17 distinctions in Accounting
 - 1 distinction in English
