Rector's FOREWORD

It is a privilege to welcome you to our 2026 Founders' Day Service of Celebration and Thanksgiving. I extend this welcome on behalf of our family of seven schools. This is the most important day in our school calendar and it is always special to share it with so many members of our Saints family and friends as we acknowledge the profound gift given to us in trust by our founders. As we mark this seventy-third anniversary of the College, I am very aware that to become a school of this size and significance is due to the many who, over the years, have shared and supported our vision. Our theme for 2026 sums this up: "Saints Journey, One Legacy".

We also celebrate the 20th anniversary of the founding of our Thandulwazi Maths and Science Academy. This pioneering venture, started in 2006, has certainly lived up to the meaning of its name: "A love of knowledge". There are many students and teachers who fly on the wings of the Thandulwazi programme. I thank Mr Velaphi Gumbi for his dedication to making a difference through education.

I am particularly struck by the link between journey and legacy. It is only as we undertake a journey that legacy develops. The founders, Albert Collins and William Mountstephens, started their journey to South Africa after changing their minds about their destination. They came to South Africa as builders, not only of structures but also invested in the values of the Methodist Church. When Gilbert Tucker broadened their vision to include a Methodist school as a legacy, they were prepared to change course.

As a school, we face the challenge of living in a volatile world. In the face of challenge, we must be prepared to journey in a different way and to adjust our course where necessary. I believe our greatest strength is our firm Methodist foundation. The intention of this service is to reaffirm our faith and Methodist roots.

I recently attended the G30 Heads of School Conference, hosted by Choate Rosemary Hall (Wallingford, Connecticut). This is an international conference but across the board the



concerns were common. Now more than ever before, schools need to remain steadfast to their values and morals. We must help our students and families navigate these turbulent times. There is no easy answer to this but I believe that it is up to each one of us in this community to be committed to a better future and to shine as beacons of hope for our students.

We are compelled to answer these questions: How do we prepare our students for the future? What would make us proud of our alumni as they live out their Saints legacy? In an era of acceleration, the G30 conference concluded that the most future-ready schools are those that remain intentionally human, strategically coherent, and deeply anchored in purpose. I was heartened to know that this fully aligns with our vision for the College and for our new strategy.

It is a delight to have Saints old boy, Dr Tinashe Chandauka, as our guest speaker. Amongst just some of his qualifications, he is an associate at Oxford Science Innovation and like our founders, a business builder. He is a biotech professional with a Ph. D. from Oxford and a Rhodes Scholar. Quoted in an interview from Physicians Off the Beaten Track, he says that if people are interested in doing something, they must make it happen: "Build the muscle to become the founder." That is a perfect concept for us to take forward. Dr Tinashe will be introduced by our Head Girl Mihle Luthuli.

I am mindful of the extent and influence of our Saints family both gathered here and across the world. The recording of this service will be watched by many Old Stithians. I hope that whether you are here on our magnificent campus, or in another part of the world, that you will know that your journey is part of our legacy as a College.

I am grateful to, and for, each one of you. To our staff and students, our parents, our alumni, Trust and Council members and invited guests, enjoy the day.

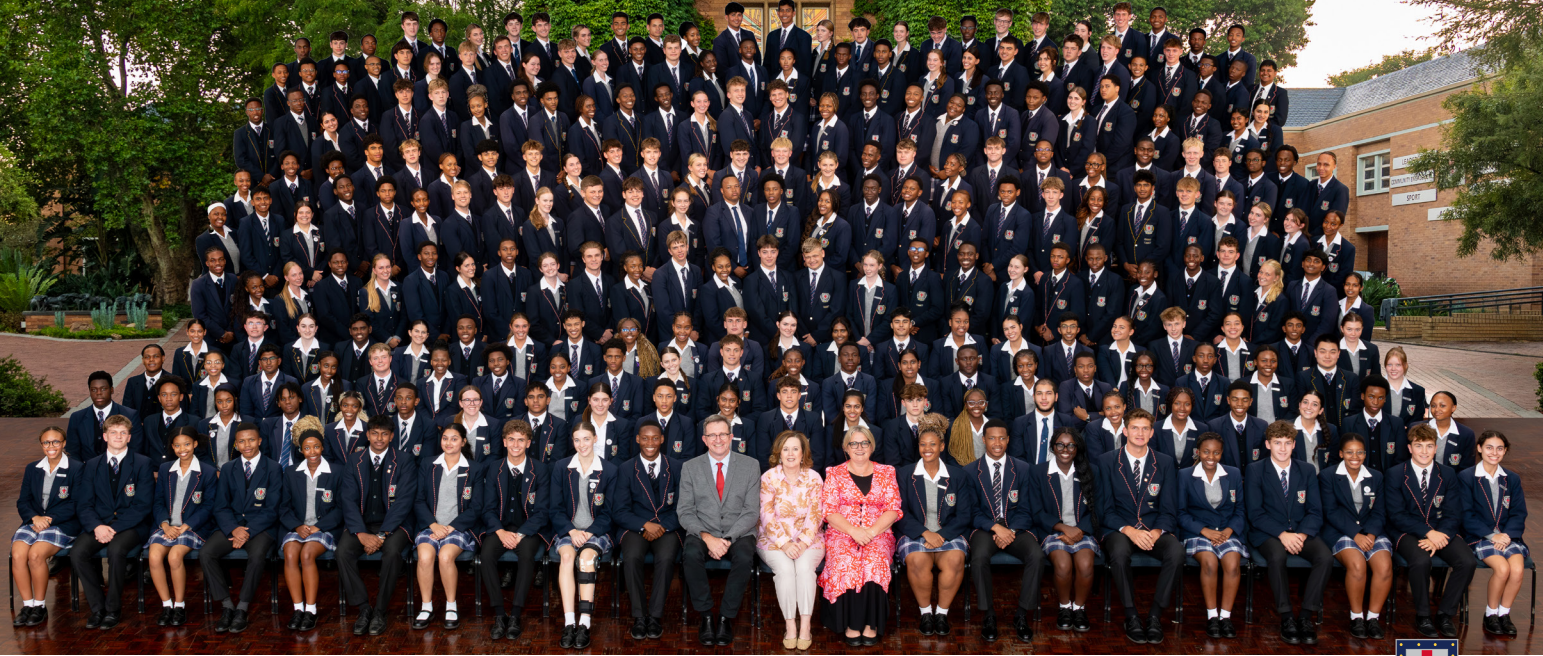




