## **RECTOR'S FOREWORD**

On this unusual Founders' Day 2020, we welcome those who are with us on campus, and those who are taking part online. I greet you on behalf of our College of seven schools – the Junior Preparatory, the Boys' Preparatory, the Boys' College, Kamoka Bush School and the Thandulwazi Maths and Science Academy. We are particularly proud that you share this service with us in the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the Girls' Preparatory and the Girls' College. Sisters and brothers together, we take courage from our theme, #BeStrongerOne&All.



Last year, as we sat in our hundreds beneath a perfect blue sky, mirrored by the sea of blue uniforms, there was no whisper of how

we would be called upon to #BeStrongerOne&All. Our Matric Class of 2020 is making history as they attend this service, sitting apart and with the echo of empty stands around them. Nothing this year has been what they expected, but this is when we gather our strength and together, we stand on the firm shoulders of the men and women who made this College possible through their grit and resilience.

As we mark the anniversary of the Girls' Schools, we remember a young Irish woman, later to become St Etaine, who, in the mid-6<sup>th</sup> Century put her faith in God to flee from a pandemic. St Etaine with her brother and sister, travelled 370km in a tiny boat, down the Shannon River, then across icy seas, finally landing on a Cornish beach. The village of Stithians is named after her. Some thirteen hundred years later, in 1880, Albert Collins left Stithians to start his own adventure. Collins met William Mountstephens and became friends, sharing a common bond of faith. As we give thanks for our Founders' generosity, we remember these were daring young people who, through their courage, touched the course of history.

Like St Etaine and our Founders, we are on a journey into an uncertain future. They adventured into the unknown; so too, have we. Our teachers and students became educational pioneers and flipped schooling upside-down. In medieval cathedrals, the shape of the roof beams represents a ship turned upside-down. We found comfort in faith and hope as we sheltered beneath our upturned ship.

The College has responded to world events. We are part of the deep tragedy wrought by COVID-19. We have been called upon by alumni and students to validate and learn from the Black Lives Matter movement. In the 2019 Founders' Day address my predecessor committed to uphold the St Stithians Statement of Intent and Purpose, 'to ensure the positive transformation and development of South African society'. Great schools have the humility to reflect but also the power to act. We continue to do both, true to our Founders' values.

Alistair Stewart discovered recently that our College hymn, *Be Thou My Vision*, was written by Christian Irish poet, Dallan Forgaill. Forgaill lived at the same time as St Etaine and just a little distance from her church. It is probable that they met. How strange but miraculous that this is our College hymn, taking us back to our roots and holding us in a circle of faith. How inspiring for us today, when the way forward is sometimes unclear, that Forgaill, a blind scholar, entreated God to be his vision in the darkness. Class of 2020, faith, and hope will always brighten your vision.

Along with St Etaine and our Founders, everyone who has been associated with St Stithians is part of its history. When we tell our section of the story, let us celebrate how we are able to #BeStrongerOne&All, as we sail together and take shelter in the heart of the Saints family. We carry with us the closing words of Dallan Forgaill's hymn:

'Great Heart of my own heart, whatever befall, Still be though my vision, O Ruler of all.'




