Why the Endowment Fund?

St Stithians College is a beacon made up of a family of South African schools, driven by the strategic intent of inspiring excellence and making a world of difference. This applies to the long-term sustainability of the College as we seek to be a beacon in our country and on the continent.

The school fees fund the operating and annual capital expenses; however, to advance the College's strategic and longer-term priorities, and to continue to develop the facilities, and remain at the forefront of holistic educational advancement, it is imperative for the College to establish and grow an Endowment Fund which can generate income for future nurturing of talent and capital expenditure from the principal investment.



An endowment is a donation to a non-profit organisation, which uses the resulting investment income for a specific purpose.





We look forward to celebrating our 75th Anniversary in 2028, through the 75th Anniversary Beacon of Light Endowment Fund Campaign.

Why R150 million?

We are setting out on a courageous voyage to raise R75 million for the St Stithians College Endowment Fund and R75 million for the Thandulwazi Trust Endowment Fund, by 2028.

The R75 million raised for the St Stithians College Endowment Fund will provide the foundation on which further funds are raised to grow the reach of this beacon of light past the 75th and 100th Anniversaries of St Stithians College. All funds and assets donated to the St Stithians College Endowment Fund will form part of the principal investment which will be managed to yield the best possible returns in order for a portion to be released after a period of time for scholarships and capital projects. The delayed use of investment income will provide sustainable impact over a longer period of time and also encourages the Endowment Fund to grow the income from the fund to ensure that the future needs of St Stithians College are covered.

The R75 million raised for the Thandulwazi Trust Maths and Science Academy Endowment Fund, will reinforce the foundation of
