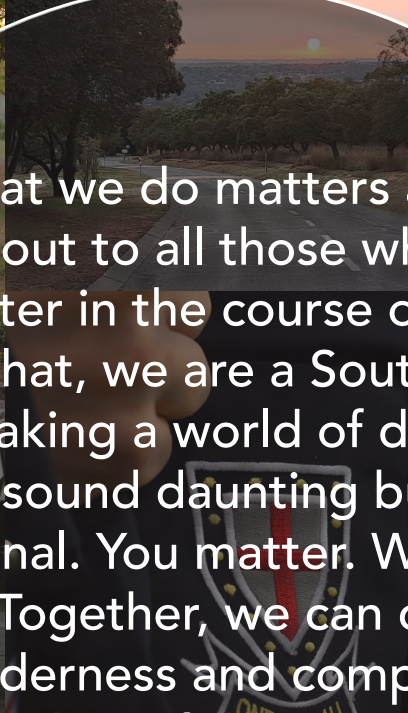
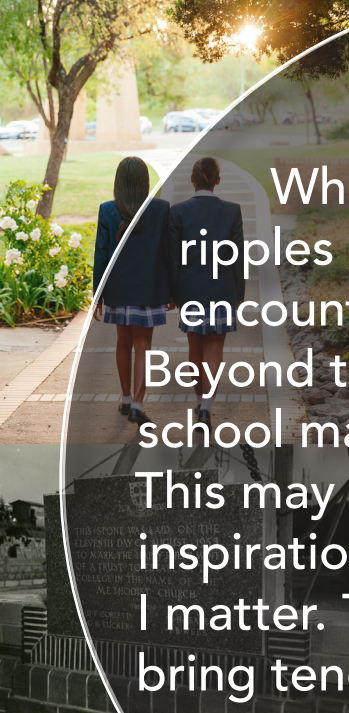

RECTOR'S FOREWORD

It is a privilege to welcome you to our 2025 Founders' Day Service of Celebration and Thanksgiving. I extend this welcome on behalf of our family of seven schools as we share this, the most important day on our calendar. Today is an opportunity to gather as a Saints family and with our friends to give thanks to our Founders. It is a joy to be able to offer gratitude to so many who have made a significant contribution to the College over its seventy-two year history.

This Founders' Day, I am particularly mindful of our College theme for 2025: "A Family of Schools. A School for Family." In a world that often seems uncertain and unpredictable, we can anchor ourselves in love and thrive if we are surrounded by a family that believes in us and wants the best for us. I believe that this is such a family.

The intention of this service is to reaffirm our faith and Methodist roots. We also give thanks for the many ways in which we have been guided along the path by men and women of vision. Families have times of celebration; this is ours. We celebrate the 30th birthday of our Girls' Schools and the Junior Primary's 25th birthday. Each family has stories that they tell about their history. There are so many in our history that have set the path for those to come. There are, inevitably, times of loss and sadness but we bear those times together. I will take the opportunity today to tell just a few of those good stories that have shaped us into who we are.

In my address, I will be reflecting on how we are called to balance the past with the present and the future. A wonderful symbol of this is the double thorn of the UmPhafa tree (*Zizyphus mucronate*). One thorn hooks backwards to hold memory while the other points to the future. We have planted a tree at the Bishop Malinga Gate and you will also see one next to the podium.

Our guest speaker, Ms Emma Mashilwane, is an important member of the Saints family.

She was appointed as the new Chair of St Stithians College Council in January.

She has an impressive and extensive Curriculum Vitae and, importantly, she has a passion for the work done by the College. I know that this woman of vision and courage will guide us in the writing of more good stories. Ms Mashilwane will be introduced by the Boys' College Head Boy, Stefano Stankovic.

I am mindful of the extent and influence of our Saints family both gathered here and across the world. The recording of this service will be watched by many Old Stithians. I hope that whether you are here on our magnificent campus, or in another part of the world, that you will be reminded of your roots and of some of the good stories that make you part of the history of Saints. In a world where negative narratives often dominate the news and social media, I encourage you to share your memories and to continue to point to the future, still rooted in our values and living the Honour Code.

I am grateful to, and for, each one of you. To our staff and students, our parents, and invited guests, enjoy the day. I hope you will leave inspired, balancing past, present and future, and ready to start another significant story.



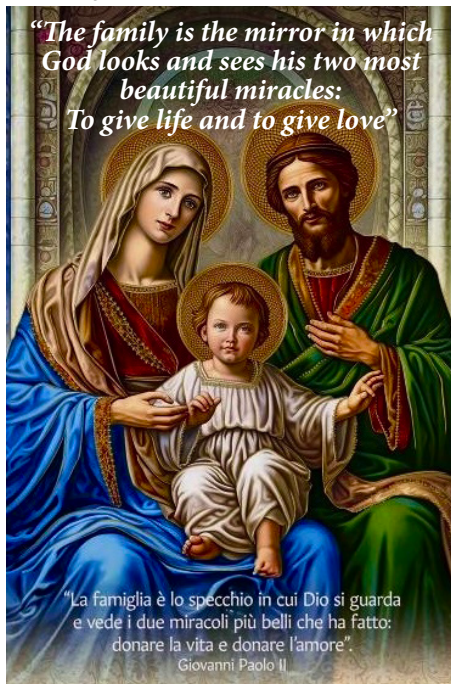
