GIVING DAY 2024

On October 15th and 16th 2024, St Stithians College held its inaugural Giving Day to raise funds for the St Stithians Endowment Fund. Why did we host this event, and why was the Endowment Fund chosen as its focus? A Giving Day rallies a community around a common cause, harnessing the power of collective giving to achieve remarkable results. By coming together with a shared purpose, communities often discover they can make a greater impact than imagined, building an Endowment legacy of support that will benefit current and future students.



THE ENDOWMENT FUND

WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND?

An Endowment Fund is a strategic financial asset that the school maintains to secure its long-term sustainability. Within the Endowment Fund, multiple dedicated funds—such as the Robert Wylde Scholarship Fund, Carel Nolte Cultural Scholarship, Old Stithian Association Endowment Fund, and the Kevin Botha Memorial Scholarship—are created to support specific areas of need and interest. These funds are invested and allowed to grow until they generate sufficient returns. It is from these returns, rather than the capital amount, that the school draws resources to fund bursaries and capital projects, ensuring a stable financial foundation for future generations. However, many donors may hesitate to contribute directly to an Endowment Fund. To address this, St Stithians has adopted a strategy similar to that of prestigious institutions like Harvard and Yale, aiming to maintain multiple specialised funds under a single, unified Endowment. While some funds may be distributed for immediate needs, the majority remain invested, benefiting from compound interest and growing over time. By drawing only a small, carefully managed portion each year, the Endowment Fund becomes a sustainable financial asset, much like any long-term investment, securing ongoing support for future generations of students.

This strategy, endorsed by the College Executive and Council, has empowered the Advancement Team to inspire past classes, individuals, and student groups to come together and create their own dedicated funds within the broader Endowment Fund. This approach instils a strong sense of pride and ownership, as each group contributes to a cause that resonates deeply with them. While progress may seem gradual to an outside observer, the Advancement Team is seeing a growing interest from alumni, parents, and community members eager to establish these funds. This increasing support reflects a deep trust in the governance of the school's Endowment Fund, with donors confident that their contributions will be stewarded responsibly and used effectively to benefit future generations.

WHO CAN START A FUND IN THE ENDOWMENT FUND?

Any member of the St Stithians community is invited to establish a dedicated fund within the Endowment Fund, contributing to the school's legacy in a meaningful and lasting way. By creating a fund, individuals, alumni, staff, parents or families can support causes close to their hearts, whether it be scholarships, cultural initiatives, sports development, or other educational priorities. These contributions are pooled and invested with care to ensure long-term growth, with returns directed toward specific areas chosen by the donor. This unique opportunity allows donors to make a sustained impact, enriching the lives of current and future students.

WHY DOES ST STITHIANS NEED ONE?

St Stithians College is guided by a long-term vision, looking ahead to the next 100 years and considering how it will sustain its beautiful campus, provide life-changing bursaries, and maintain state-of-the-art facilities. Establishing and growing an Endowment Fund will create a stable, enduring revenue stream, generated from the interest on invested funds. This proactive financial foundation will allow the school to meet future needs without relying solely on traditional funding sources. Today's leadership is committed to passing down not only a magnificent school but also the financial resources to secure its future, ensuring St Stithians' legacy of excellence for generations to come.





The purpose of Giving Day was to raise funds for key initiatives within the Endowment Fund, including scholarships, infrastructure improvements, and support for the Thandulwazi Maths and Science Academy. It was essential to unite our community in working together for the good of “One and All.” Through a series of engaging activities and heartfelt appeals, the St Stithians community responded with incredible generosity, raising an impressive R4,600,000 in just 36 hours. This remarkable achievement highlights the power of collective giving and the deep commitment of our supporters to securing a bright future for the College.

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO ORGANISE A GIVING DAY?

- A stable partner to provide the donor platform – Charidy provided us with the platform and guidance on how to mobilise our community
- A call centre to be set up with 15 phones
- 15 Laptops loaded with a calling database (built by Advancement) and an email programme
- Secure, wifi and backup power
- A venue – Higher Ground Restaurant, as the home of the St Stithians Alumni was selected
- 6 administration volunteers at the call centre to keep the systems moving and assisting call centre agents
- Design a campaign with slogans, videos and communications to raise awareness about the campaign
- Mobilise over 50 alumni class volunteers from classes from 1960’s to 2000’s and over 200 call centre volunteers over 2 days to work 2 hour shifts comprising of alumni, parents, staff and community members
- Payment Gateways to be set up for via PayGate and Stripe to facilitate the payments
- 6000 phone numbers to be built into a small database
- 2 MCs to keep everyone motivated on the day
- 4 banners and one balloon arch to keep passersby informed
- Over 50 potential matcher donors approached

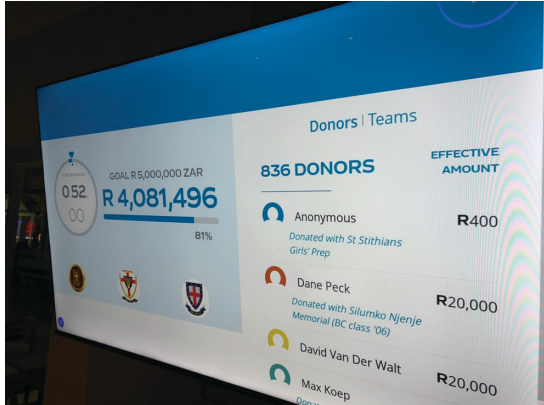

THE ACTUAL GIVING DAY

AS IT HAPPENED

– It's a rollercoaster ride!

15 OCTOBER 2024

6:00

The advancement team arrived to test the phones (set up the previous afternoon) and check that power and Wi-Fi are all working.

6:30

The power fails - turns out it's an electrical fault (not Eskom) and everything comes back online.

7:30

Emma Mashilwane, Rev Elroy, Celeste Gilardi and Alistair Stewart officiate the opening along with the first shift of volunteers and the Advancement team.

7:45

The first cohort of volunteers are trained to use the phones and the database.

8:00

Phone calls begin with a focus on South Africa and countries in the East such as Hong Kong, Australia, etc.

12:00

After 3 shifts and 60 volunteers working on the call centre the **R1m mark is met**. The bell is rung wildly. The Thandulwazi intern teachers and staff worked on this shift. The joy is sensational.

14:00

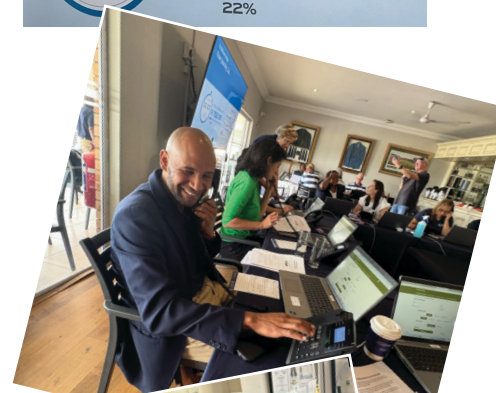
The afternoon slump and all our fears appear as we wonder how on earth we are going to do this! But we re-energise and keep going. America has woken up and we begin calling our alumni and community in that country. They are amazing and fire us all up.

16:00

The College Executive comes on to the call centre to work a 2-hour shift. Much laughter is had and the visual graph crawls towards the R1.5m mark. The word is spreading amongst our parent body and quite a few large corporate donations come in. This inspires us!

18:00

The Old Stithian Association committee and parents come in to work the phones. They are meant to end at 8pm but the thrill of trying to get to R2m keeps us calling until 10pm, but we still aren't at R2m.



22:00

Advancement team and last volunteers go home with R1,938,000 raised and feeling hopeful that international donations will come in through the night. It's been an incredible day and we are very grateful for the support shown by One&All. But we need some rest to start again fresh tomorrow.

23:58

We reach R2m!

16 OCTOBER 2024

6:00

We awaken to see that we are through the R2m mark (we confess that most of us checked its progress multiple times during the night).

7:00

We test phones - everything is working, we are ready and fired up for day two and start the day by celebrating the R2 million mark. Everyone is raring to go, there is so much energy in the room.

8:00

Our volunteers begin calling and many volunteers from the previous day turn up unexpectedly to assist again as they enjoyed it so much. We are surprised and inspired by the enthusiasm that is building through the St Stithians Community.

10:00

Next shift arrives and includes Chris Dykes who already worked 10 hours the day before! We keep the phone calls consistent and Warren Tanner-Ellis is encouraging everyone and handing out spot prizes wildly.

14:38

We reach the **R3m mark**, elated but daunted by how far we still have to go. Akiva from Charidy encourages us and we keep going. There are fresh, enthusiastic volunteers and a consistent stream of donations that keep us fired up.

18:12

We go through the **R4m mark** and we celebrate wildly. Suddenly the target seems possible and we see a surge of energy on the call centre and from the donors.

21:00

R4.3m we decide we all need sleep and head home. We did not yet know that an additional R300 000 would still come in over the forthcoming week.

We received numerous congratulatory messages from members of the St Stithians community, many of whom were amazed that we reached an incredible R4.6 million in such a short time. This outpouring of support and generosity highlighted the shared pride and unity within our community, as well as the collective commitment to St Stithians' future.

FUN FACTS

955 Donors + 30 Matchers!

Higher Ground waitering staff were so excited by what they saw happening that the waiters offered to donate their tips from the day (we declined them but were so grateful for their generosity)!

The longest call centre volunteer was Chris Dykes (Class of 1990) who worked on the call centre for over 18 hours over the two days!

The biggest donation received by a call centre agent was R50000 matched to R100 000.

150 cupcakes consumed by volunteers.

The Boys' College hand held school bell was rung every time we received a donation over R10000 or we reached a major milestone – it was rung 27 times!

521 donations were received on Tuesday 15th October and 387 donations on the 16th of October, however R2,033,300.00 was donated on 15th and R2,390,011.50 on the 16th.

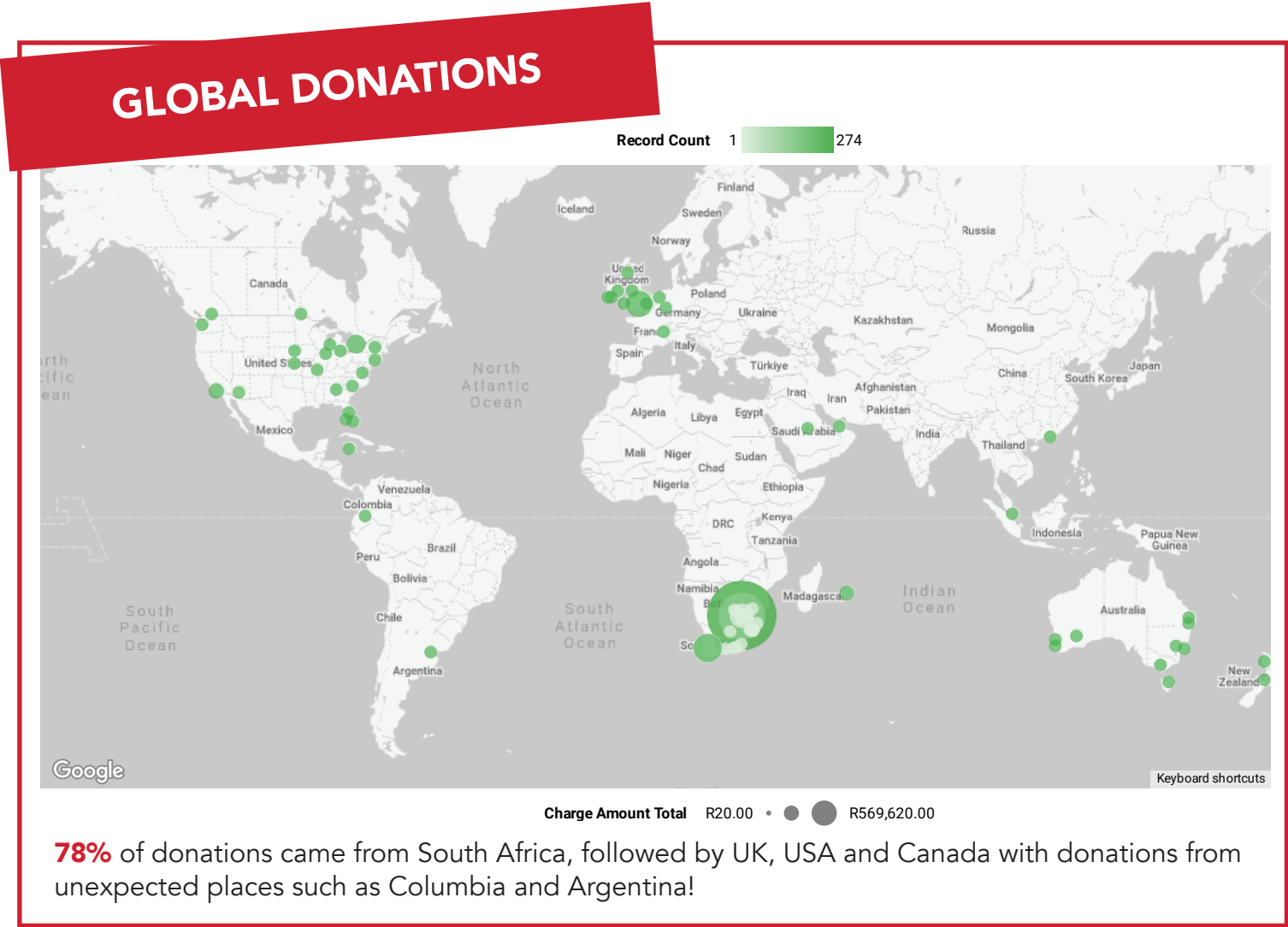

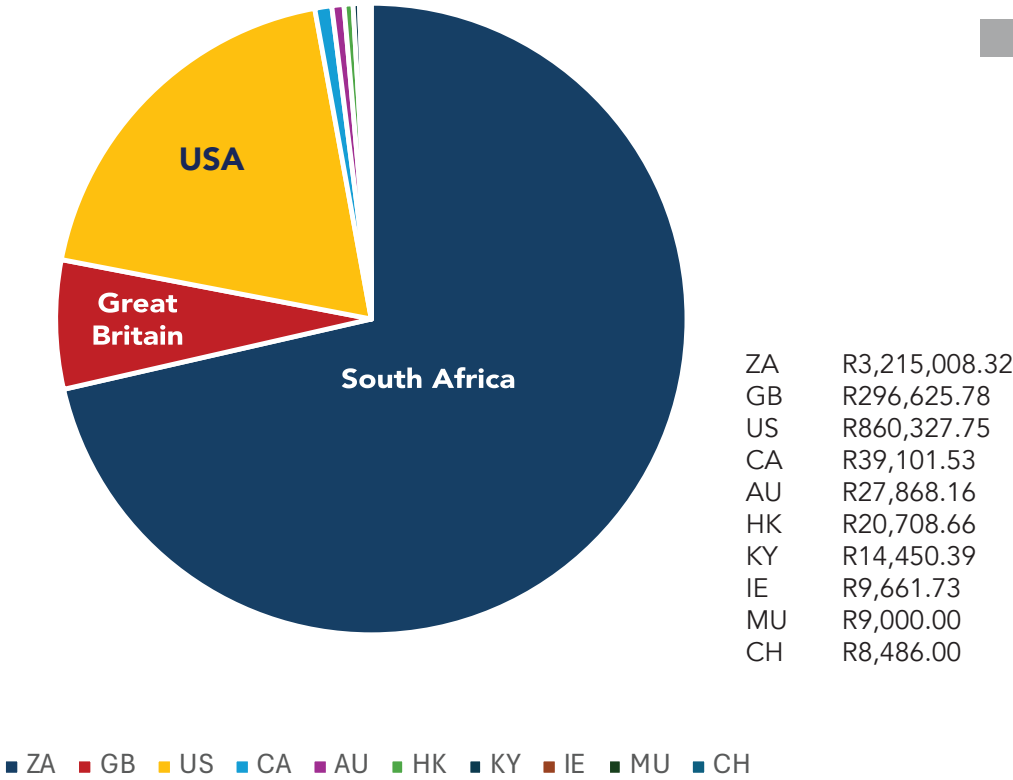

peers to participate and donate, one could really tell in Giving day venue when a class was being encouraged.

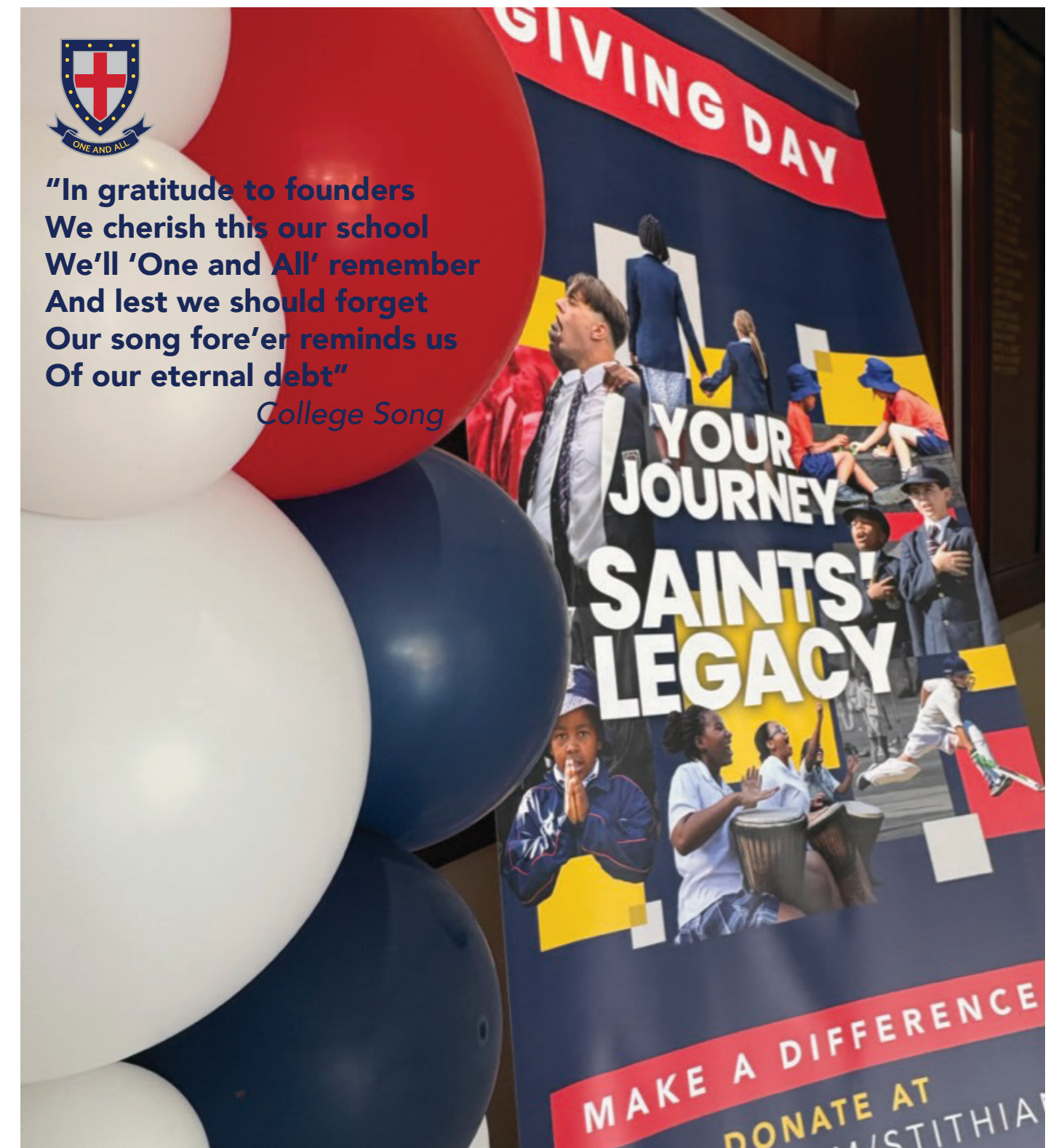
