
HERITAGE & COMMUNITY: A CELEBRATION OF IDENTITY

I would like to thank the OSA for your connection with me, and with the College, over this past year. From robust and respectful conversations about SportsFest, to regular chats with our BC Liaison Jock Seeliger, to meetings about Crusaders, Hockey, the pitch on Baytopp, or perhaps discussions about funding for a few current students, or to really wonderful reunions with classes of 2014, 2004, 1994, 1984 and 1974, and the OSA gathering in London, I have enjoyed my engagement with the OSA.

After all, we are all wanting what is best for the College. We have amazing staff and leaders in the College who care deeply about your alma mater. I have loved feeling your OSA passion and care for our space, perhaps no more clearly felt than with the 2004 reunion group who loudly sang war cries, clad in their reunion t-shirts, as we took on Parktown at the Astroturf and on Baytopp.

A few current conversations that are happening at BC and have relevance for our alumni are the work we are doing on Baytopp Field, the removal of the Bathroom Block in Chapel Quad, and discussion about our 'Old Man' Wysteria in our Chapel Quad.

We have decided, after much discussion and consideration of our school needs, to remove the cricket pitch off Baytopp Field. This will allow this field to be set up specifically as a Football and Rugby field. This is to accommodate the growth of these sporting codes, the number of fixtures, and the specific preparation of the field for those purposes.

I am grateful to parents and alumni who have contributed financially to this project.

For many years we have wanted to remove the Bathroom Block in the Chapel Quad. Our quad is a beautiful space, so it is unfortunate that the centre-piece has been a bathroom.

We will be changing this building into a multiuse, modern space which will enhance the appeal of the quad, and be a much needed venue for teaching and learning. We look forward to unveiling this change in 2025.

I am engaged in an annual discussion about our favourite tree, 'Old Man Wysteria', in the Chapel Quad. This tree was planted in 1954 to commemorate the laying of the Foundation Stone of the Chapel.

It is a living part of our history, and if we could talk to the 'Old Man' we would surely gather some fascinating stories. However, the branches are sagging ever lower, and the tree is struggling. There will come a time when we will have to make the tough call to remove the tree. This would be a momentous decision.

We have planned ahead and in 2018 planted two Wysteria trees either side of the 'Old Man' such that they will provide shade and the same ambience in the future.

I have also been engaged in discussions about how carpenters might be able to do something special with the wood of the tree so that its legacy and memory will live on, and continue to serve our community.



SAINTS GIVING DAY


