MESSAGE FROM OLD STITHIAN CHAIRMAN: ISRAEL SKOSANA



Dear Old Stithians,

As we close out 2025, I am struck by how the story of St Stithians continues to intertwine with the broader story of South Africa one of resilience, renewal, and a deep sense of coming home.

This year, more than ever, I have felt an overwhelming gratitude for our Saints community, for the legacy we share, and for the privilege of witnessing the momentum building not only on our campus, but across our country. One of the most significant trends of the past two years confirmed by immigration consultants, property trends, and private wealth movements is the meaningful number of South Africans choosing to return home, with a 70% increase in South Africans abroad seeking to return home according to DNA Employer of Record.

Families are coming back from the UK, Australia, the UAE, and the US for one core reason:

South Africa feels like home in a way no other country can.

Why South Africans Are Returning

- Economic opportunity is rising again, with Johannesburg regaining its position as Africa's financial capital.
- A strengthening rand and moderating inflation have improved medium-term confidence.
- Lower cost of high-quality living vs global metros (schools, domestic support, lifestyle).
- A renewed belief in shaping the future of our country, not simply observing it from afar.
- The G20 spotlight, positioning South Africa as a global economic and geopolitical leader.
- And most importantly: a yearning for belonging, for community, for the warmth of home.

And when South Africans return with their families, do you know what they look for first?
A school that represents excellence, values, and a sense of home.

A school like St Stithians.

2025 was the year South Africa hosted the G20 a first for Africa and a generational milestone that will be remembered for decades. I was privileged to be involved in engagements around banking and finance, representing a proudly South African institution in global conversations about economic transformation. And as delegates from across the world visited Johannesburg, one message echoed strongly:

Their performances this term were exceptional, with the final ensemble concert at Rosebank Union Church standing out as a celebration of musical excellence. Our Matric Art Exhibition was another highlight—an extraordinarily strong group whose final practical results are eagerly anticipated.



Term 3 is a short and busy summer sports season. Highlights included our water polo First Team winning the Saints Invitational Tournament; Jenna Kirk securing two gold medals at the annual SANESA Equestrian event; and the annual Chloé Nel (Class of 2022) Tennis Tournament, where Gabrielle Steytler (Grade 10) emerged as this year's champion.

At the Girls' College, community engagement is about forging meaningful partnerships that extend beyond our campus. This work expresses our belief in social cohesion and shared humanity. Our Boost a Buddy partnership with Iphutheng Primary in Alexandra remains a beautiful example of connection and reciprocity. The relationships built between our Grade 8 students and their Grade 6 buddies filled with laughter, learning, and genuine care remind us that service is most impactful when rooted in relationship.

We are currently preparing to host a Christmas party for children supported by Swarango, the Alexandra-based soup kitchen founded by the remarkable Mpho Mashigo. Swarango now provides daily meals to around 178 children, and our partnership with them has deepened each year. Our students will prepare lunch, organise games, and ensure that each child receives a special Christmas gift.

Looking ahead, we are planning the installation of four temporary prefabricated classrooms alongside Baytopp Field to accommodate our College's growth. We also remain hopeful that the long-envisioned expansion of the Girls' School Resource Centre will come to fruition at the outset of 2026 enabling of further learning and teaching spaces to accommodate our growing school. We are excited, too, about the new legacy garden in the AvZ quad made possible by the generous contributions of the Class of 2025.


