Talking about Reunions, there will be a **Reunion in March in Cape Town and one in the USA later in the year**, dates are pending but they are both in the pipeline and as soon as they are confirmed, we will let you know. Also happening soon is our **Easter Festival** <http://events.stithian.com/events/easter2016/> which once again is shaping up to be an exciting time on campus with some great teams arriving at our gates to take part in a number of sports over the Easter weekend.

As it is with our great school, we are always growing and with growth comes construction. The school is a mass of people doing great things to our campus and **I want to acknowledge one specific Alumnus, Carel Nolte**. Seeing the growth of our school and potential being created through the development on campus, him and his family donated a sum of R3 million towards the developments. A gesture of generosity that will help to continue the work on the property, as well as lay future foundations for growth, and I want to thank him for being so generous with this donation.

My appeal is that if there is a way you can get involved in shaping the face of the school, that you take the opportunity to give something back to a school that gave you so much. This may be an assumption on my part and if it is incorrect I apologise. With simple opportunities like the **“Hundred Club” which will cost you R100 a month** or the **“Make your Mark Campaign” for badges which cost R350** once off, you have the opportunity to make a significant difference to the future of our school.

A further opportunity will be launched later this month, which is a very exciting time for us, partly because it has taken nearly two years to finish. **The OSA is now a fully licensed Society Lottery**. The details will follow soon, but this is something that you are going to want to take advantage of. 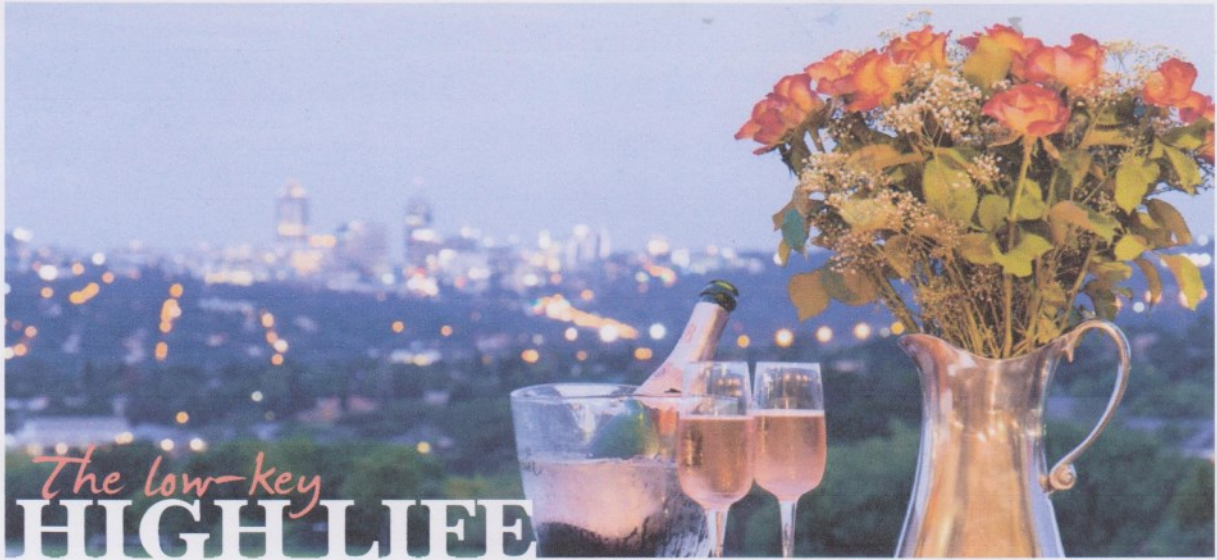

The low-key HIGHER LIFE

Higher Ground Restaurant offers the splendour of a panoramic view of Jozi's skyline within a relaxed environment

"The moment I saw its view, I knew this was a restaurant I could work with," says Mark Burger. He's referring to the breathtaking cityscape that's visible from almost every one of Higher Ground Restaurant's tables. From its location, at the top of St Stithians College's grounds in the northern suburbs, you have an unobstructed view of the Joburg and Sandton skyline.

Higher Ground attracts an ever-growing group of regulars – some of the familiar faces pop in up to four times a week

"The restaurant that was here at the time of my first visit was very quiet, but I saw the potential to transform it into one of Joburg's top meeting spots." And so Mark, who has more than 30 years' experience in the restaurant business, and his team set about knocking down walls, putting in glass sliding doors and styling the interiors to turn Higher Ground into what it is today: a light and welcoming space.

Higher Ground now attracts an ever-growing group of regulars. Mark jokes that some of the familiar faces spend more time at his restaurant than at their own homes, popping in up to four times a week. On hearing this, we glance around the restaurant, expecting to see guests loosening their ties, kicking off their shoes and sinking into the comfortable couches.

It's just after six on a Wednesday evening and tables are filling up fast. What's striking is the assortment of people in the restaurant's different areas – executives unwinding over sundowners on the roomy deck, families having an early bite in the patio area and teenagers making the most of the summer weather at tables on the grass. It looks like Mark really has created a second home for all Joburgers.

After spending the evening chatting with Mark and his team, tasting one their signature dishes, the salmon stacker (a beautifully presented mould of avocado, tomato and capers topped with smoked salmon and cream cheese, and served with bruschetta), and walking through the restaurant's many areas, we think it's the casual atmosphere, fuss-free



décor, friendly staff (everyone's been with Higher Ground since 2013) and popular menu items – as much as *that* view – that keep people coming back for more.

Coming soon Within the next few months Higher Ground will be adding "pizzas with a twist" to the menu.

Good to know Higher Ground is the perfect venue for any function or special occasion. No matter your taste or budget, the team will pull out all the stops to create a memorable experience. #
