# Letter from the Rector, Dr Tim Nuttall

The year 2015 to date has been an exciting period of new beginnings as we build on our impressive legacy. There have been some outstanding achievements in many facets of education across our schools. There are also opportunities to grow, learn and improve.

I write to highlight a few themes of specific interest to our alumni. In summary, I address the following:

- \* Admissions policy new developments
- \* Strategy 2025 and our Purpose Statement
- \* Institutional Advancement creating a community of belonging and a sustainable future
- \* Three Pavilions Campaign
- \* A call for skills, expertise and a willingness to assist St Stithians
- \* A College of seven schools and leadership appointments
- \* Easter Sports Festival

#### Admissions policy – new developments

Over the past six months, we have reviewed and improved our admissions process. We have created a scoring matrix, with points allocated to alumni, sibling and transformation categories. Each category is critical to the character of St Stithians today. Alumni connect the school to its lineage. Siblings are integral to our value proposition as a College of boys' and girls' schools on one campus. The enrolment of black students contributes to the institutional and cultural transformation of St Stithians as a proudly South African school. Rather than a hierarchy of these categories, on which the current policy is based, the new matrix enables applicants to be ranked on the accumulation of relevant points per category.

We welcome applications from Old Stithians. To gain full points as an alumnus, life membership of the Old Stithian Association is necessary. To confirm your OSA membership status, or to apply to become a member, please contact the OSA Secretary, Susannah Knowles on <a href="mailto:alumni@stithian.com">alumni@stithian.com</a>. Third generation alumni are given additional recognition. The date of application is a fourth category which is very important in the weighting of applicants. The points here are earned on a sliding scale, with the highest points generated if application is made at date of birth. Date of application is therefore a critical criterion, and the simple message is: the sooner the better.

In the case of Grade R applicants for 2016, the pattern is that the first round of offers (made in November 2014) were typically made to those parents who had booked their child in within three months of birth. The above outline describes the new admissions framework. The Admissions Policy document is nearing finalisation and will appear on the St Stithians website shortly.

#### Strategy 2025 and our new Purpose Statement

During March the Council approved a new Statement of Intent and Purpose, as well as Strategy 2025, a strategic framework for the next ten years. The document and its bold vision will be officially launched at Founders' Day, 6 June 2015. Inspiring Excellence. Making a World of Difference – this is our new Statement of Intent. On this platform we will continue to develop and offer a dynamic and distinctive St Stithians education. #### Institutional Advancement - creating a community of belonging and a sustainable future

The College is setting up an Advancement Office with one of its core goals being to grow a community of belonging amongst our alumni and past parents, working in partnership with the Old Stithian Association. The Advancement Office will have responsibility for admissions, marketing, fundraising, alumni relations and the College archive. The overall goal is to advance the brand and enhance the long-term sustainability of St Stithians College. I have appointed Alistair Stewart, current Head of the Boys' Prep, to the position of Advancement Director from 1 July 2015. Julia Phipps is our Alumni Affairs Officer in the Advancement Office.

#### Three Pavilions Campaign

We are proceeding with plans to build a Boys' Sports Pavilion next to the High Performance Centre and overlooking the Cricket Oval and Baytopp fields, and a Girls' Sports Pavilion at the tennis and netball courts. The third pavilion in the campaign is the redesigned Conference Room at the One & All clubhouse.

We are at an advanced planning stage of the Boys' Sports Pavilion, which will consist of changing rooms and sports offices downstairs, and a long room and social viewing area upstairs. The upper floor of the Pavilion will be accessible from the Jamieson fields. A graphic of the architect's design is reproduced below (Phase 2 of the project is to expand the existing High Performance Centre, as indicated in the background):



We are inviting donations totalling R2.5m to reach our target of R10m required to fund the new pavilion pictured above. The College's capex budget, the St Stithians Foundation and the My School Fund contribute the first R5m. A further R2.5m has been pledged in donations to date, and we are looking for the remaining R2.5m donations to enable us to proceed. Our plan is to build a Girls' Sports Pavilion in 2016, as a major project in celebration of the 21st birthday of the girls' schools. Concept drawings are in progress, and we will fund the building through a school contribution and matching donor funds. The specifications include much-needed changing rooms, sports offices, and social and viewing spaces which will look out over the tennis and netball courts. The new One & All Pavilion is intended to improve the facility to host sports teams and spectators. This is the first step in a bold plan to create additional fields and sports facilities in the upper campus zone. The OSA Committee and the College are jointly keen to progress this project, which is currently being drawn up by the architect, and individuals interested in assisting are welcomed to express their support to the individuals listed above.

#### A call for skills, expertise and a willingness to assist St Stithians

We appreciate the involvement of our alumni in our schools. In addition to participating in the Old Stithian Association and Crusaders Sport, and in addition to being parents of children enrolled at Saints, the school looks to our alumni to assist us in our governance structures and in achieving our strategic objectives. #### A College of seven schools and leadership appointments

The preamble of our Statement of Purpose describes St Stithians as follows:

St Stithians College is a proudly South African school, embracing diversity and offering a distinctive educational experience. Founded in 1953 as a Methodist Church School, our Christian spirituality is central to our identity. Our College consists of primary and secondary boys' and girls' schools, together with a co-educational junior primary school. We are an independent, non-profit institution located on an expansive green campus in Sandton, Johannesburg. In addition, St Stithians incorporates Kamoka Bush School near Modimolle, and the Thandulwazi Maths & Science Academy on our campus.

In addition to the five schools which operate daily on our campus, St Stithians created Kamoka Bush School in 2011 on a game farm in Limpopo – <a href="www.stithian.com/index.php/kamoka-bush-school">www.stithian.com/index.php/kamoka-bush-school</a>. I was pleased to appoint Stephen Baytopp as the new Director in January, to succeed our founding Director, Kate Doyle. Our seventh school is Thandulwazi, which takes place on our campus on Saturdays, and includes the employment of 35 young teacher interns – <a href="www.thandulwazi.com">www.thandulwazi.com</a>. Thandulwazi has grown into a significant educational and community engagement programme, impacting on over 2 300 high school students and primary school teachers annually. In recognition of this I appointed Dr Themba Mthethwa in February as the first full-time Director of the Academy.

Jakes Fredericks (one of the current Deputy Heads) has been appointed as the new Head of the Boys' Prep, and he will assume office on 1 July 2015. The recruitment process is underway for the appointment of a replacement for Mel Dace who is retiring at the end of the year as the founding Head of the Junior Prep.

#### Easter Sports Festival

St Stithians experienced a bumper Easter Sports Festival. The event began with the inaugural Prep Sports Festival during the weekend before Easter – rugby under lights on the Wayne Joubert field, and netball under lights on the Girls' courts. The success of the Prep Sports Festival will result in its expansion in 2016. In the main Easter Sports Festival, 1 200 players from 47 schools took part in six sporting codes: rugby, hockey, netball, tennis, basketball and squash. The standard of sport and the Festival spirit were of high quality, and this was a proudly St Stithians event – the oldest and largest school sports festival in the country.

#### Conclusion

St Stithians College is embracing the present and the future with alacrity, while drawing on the inspiration of our past. 

# **Crusaders Junior Rugby Club**

As part of the Old Stithian Association's continued support towards the growth and sustainability of the school, we are proud to continue with the 3<sup>rd</sup> season of Crusaders Rugby Club. Under the stewardship and watchful eye of Freddie Grobler, Director of Rugby at the Boys' College and architect of the Bulls' Rugby Academy, and his team, we have developed a 10 week program focusing on basic skills, techniques and conditioning required for rugby at all ages. We will be using the experience and skill of professional coaches during the season, as well as one or two players, depending on availability, from the professional ranks of South African Rugby.

The program will focus on:

Individual skills development
Understanding Sport
Speed and Agility
Fitness and Strength
Hand, eye, foot coordination
Technical sport specific training
Tournaments
Tag, sevens and full fifteen man rugby
Fun and Games

These sessions will coincide with the build-up to the Prep Rugby season and will focus on equipping the boys with skills and knowledge to enhance their own game or introduce newcomers to the sport, with the ultimate goal of ensuring their readiness for rugby in the College.

The age groups will only play internal club games for this season to ensure we have the correct numbers to enter the club into a league, and to ensure we set a solid foundation of skills to play other more established clubs in years to come. Our season will run during the second term of 2015 and more detailed information on the times will be communicated when you sign up. The time table for these sessions is as follows and practices will take place on the Wayne Joubert Field below the One & All Club:

Monday & Wednesday 17:30 – 18:30 U8 and U10

Tuesday & Thursday 17:30 – 18:30 U7, U9, U11, U12 and Open

Crusaders Rugby will be running on the same academy style format as it did in 2014, focusing on skills and drills to enhance the rugby in the junior ranks at St Stithians and support the work being done in the Prep and the College in preparing the boys for college rugby. The sessions will be at a cost of R850 for the season and will include the cost of the Crusaders Rugby Training Jersey which will be ordered and delivered in the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of the season.
