We reported in the February Newsletter that 5 Old Stithians from the Class of 2007 graduated as Medical Doctors, but can also add Bryon De John (2007) who graduated from UCT at the end of 2013 with a 1st Class Pass and Distinction. A wonderful achievement from the Class of 2007!

Kagiso Rabada (2013) was part of the recent SA U19 Cricket team that played in the World Cup in Dubai. Kagiso took 6/15 as Australia was bowled out for 150, chasing South Africa's 230/9 in the semifinal and was also named man of the

match. They then bowled Pakistan out for 131 in 44.3 overs. SA reached the modest target of 132 with 7.5 overs to spare. It is the first time since the Under 19s World Cup began in 1988 that South Africa have lifted the trophy.

<u>Kevin Anderson</u> (2003) has reached a career high of 18th

in the world after reaching both the Mexican Open final in which he lost against Grigor Dimitrov, 7-6 (1), 3-6, 7-6 (5) and the Delray Beach final the week before where he lost 7-6 (6), 6-7 (7), 6-4 against Marin Cilic.

Chris Baker (2011) has been selected for the South African Mens' Waterpolo Team to participate at the Commonwealth Waterpolo Championships, which will be held in Aberdeen, Scotland from 5 - 12 April.

According to SA School Sport Magazine www.saschools.co.za for February 2014, Kearsney College and St Stithians had the highest number of SA Schools representatives (5 each) in the country for 2013 — Claudio Fernandes (2013), Luke Hunter (2013), Lwazi Madi (2013) - Waterpolo, Kagiso Radebe (2013) Cricket, & Keegan Kieck (2013) Hockey.

We wish Ken Hovelmeier (St Stithians teacher, Director of Post Matric and Student Affairs, School Counsellor, MiC Squash), all the very best with his recovery after recent serious health difficulties. His wife Myrna has sent us this update "Having struggled with blood flow problems to the extremities as a result of having been a diabetic for 64 years, Ken was on a "pain management" course for 6 months (April – September 2013). He had severe pain in his right leg, which was gangrenous from toes to calf. In September 2013 the pain was so severe that he was ambulanced to hospital on a Sunday, and the right leg was amputated below the knee on the Monday. All went well, he was discharged from hospital relatively quickly, and the rehabilitation period started. By December 2013, Ken was being measured and fitted with a prosthetic leg and was making good progress until March 2014. Unfortunately, the blood flow in the left leg was also inadequate. As a result the big toe had to be amputated in March 2014. This wound did not heal and after a six week stay in hospital the left leg had to be amputated too. There is probably no chance of prosthetics for a blind double amputee, but as one of his past students said: "Ken is a MIND MAN, so he will get sorted and be his usual self!" Our thanks for the tremendous support received from 'One and All' and the wider Saints family across the world." Myrna Hovelmeier



History

NEW CO-EDUCATIONAL COLLEGE

A perspective of St Stithian's College as it will appear when complete (above) on the 240 acres purchased by the Methodist Church, between Ferndale and Bryanston. The site is nine miles north of Johannesburg, where the grounds and playing fields are now being laid out.

The lower photograph shows the grounds as they are today, considerable progress having been made with the laying-out of playing fields and terracing for the school buildings.

While browsing through a book called "Like It Was - The Star - 100 years in Johannesburg" Barry Hosford came across this article and sent it to us.

Letters of Mr E M ("Monty") Harris

Letters of Mr E M ("Monty") Harris

"Monty" Harris was one of the first four staff members of St Stithians College in 1953. From the first few days of the College until April 1961, shortly before he died during a holiday visit to his sister Lilian in England, he recorded the early years of the development of the College in letters to Lilian. Following his death and at the request of Mr Mears, the first Headmaster of the College, Miss Harris typed up the extracts about St Stithians that Monty had written in his airmail letters. These were first issued in 1969. (volume 1: 1953 - 1956) and a second volume (1957 - 1961) followed. Few extant copies remain. The Archives copy is a signed copy that formerly belonged to Lindsay Baytopp, the first groundsman after whom Baytopp field is named.

Here are a few extracts from the letters:

Jan 31st [1953]:

"Yes, St Stithians has been "alive" for four days and it would not be far out to say that I, too, have been alive for the same period ... On Tuesday Mr Mears called for me at 9.a.m. and we proceeded to the house of Mr Tucker (he is an Accountant and one of the Council of the College) to pick up one desk and a load of books. From there to Ferndale where we picked up the two lady members of staff and thence the short journey to the school. The morning was spent in checking books, etc. and in the afternoon the boarders began to arrive. The boys are not a little proud of the fact that they will always be known as founder pupils. Wednesday was the great day. We were on the job about 7.20 a.m. ready for the influx of the nippers who do not live in. This is my first experience of classes for the "fives" and I have never seen so many small boys crying at the same time. ...

Feb 28th:

"And now to the doings of the week which has seen the first purchase of a St S cane and the use thereof. One of the Standard VII's [Grade 9's] so far forgot himself as to play the fool in Afrikaans lessons. I wonder whether he will go down in history as the first founder student to be caned."

The College Archives has undertaken, at the request of the Class of '63 who recently gathered for their 50th reunion, to produce a limited edition reprint of these delightful items which contain a unique record of the early years of the school. Mr Baytopp's copy and its companion volume have been digitised, printed and bound as replica sets of the originals.

These booklets are being made available to the Saints family, past and present, at R130-00 for the two volume set. Funds raised from this project will go towards the development of a Living History Museum in which the history of the College can be displayed and explored in both real and virtual formats.

In the past, Alumni and the OSA have been involved in the development of fields, lighting of fields, building of the HPC, donating funds for various projects around the campus and a number of bursaries to current and former pupils of our great school.

PHASE 1

The Pavillion will be built overlooking the current Wayne Joubert Field (directly below the Higher Ground). It will be built with increased change room facilities to help with the number of sporting events on the field as well as surrounding areas. It will also include a large open area which can be setup for catering for sports teams and supporters alike. The facility will provide viewing areas for the current Wayne Joubert Field and the newly envisaged field which will form part of Phase 2.

PHASE 2 ADJACENT FIELD

The current 'sand' field adjacent to the Higher Ground Conference Room is an opportunity to grow the overall school resources. The plan is to grass, irrigate and light the current field to make way for various setups for different sports. This will include space for two football/rugby fields and a cricket pitch. The pitch in the current Baytopp field will be removed and relocated so as to create a dedicated 1st team rugby field at the school. This development will create more space for current school teams as well as Crusaders sports teams and at the same time remove some pressure on the current fields.

PHASE 3

The past few years has seen an increase in sporting codes offered on campus, many of which have the need for indoor facilities. This phase of the project will see the development of either the free space adjacent to the Higher Ground Conference Room or the current 'cabbage patch' field next to the pools. This facility will be able to host indoor hockey, netball and basketball for the learners as well as the Crusaders sporting codes. This facility will also be able to double up as a hall facility for the girls school.
