My thanks to for the good wishes to me on my 80th birthday, with photograph and text, in the Old Stithian Newsletter for March and April 2014.

Congratulations on the quality of the newsletter. I found it useful and very interesting. The headline above the photographs that Barry Hosford supplied for the History section was fascinating. I had never heard that the intention had been to found a co-educational school. Mears and Collins had, as staunch Methodists, been admirers of Kingswood College, Bath, in their native England - a boys' school. Having come to South Africa as unemployed artisans and then made their fortunes, they expressed disappointment in the lack of a similar religious ethos in state schools here. The trustees of their estates took heed of their wishes, and the school was built. Some of these trustees and their advisers had been educated at Kingswood in Grahamstown, then a boys' school, as had the first Headmaster, Wally Mears, who came on retirement from Rondebosch, very much a boys' school.

When I came to St Stithians as Headmaster in 1969, I was asked by the Council to draft a five-year plan, which I did. I included a recommendation that a girls' school should be set up on the campus. The Methodist Church did not agree with this, because they thought that it would threaten the existence of Epworth, the Methodist girls' school in Pietermaritzburg, which was at that time dependent upon boarders from Johannesburg. Twenty years later, without knowing of my recommendation, David Wylde had the same idea, and the co-ordinate model was established.

It is interesting that the photographs appeared under the heading co-educational. Not only had I not ever heard of that intention; the architect's drawings, his plans and indeed the buildings showed no sign of any thought of including girls in the school lists.

Letters of Mr E M ("Monty") Harris - Order Form

"Monty" Harris was one of the first four staff members of St Stithians College in 1953. From the first few days of the College until April 1961, shortly before he died during a holiday visit to his sister Lilian in England, he recorded the early years of the development of the College in letters to Lilian. Following his death and at the request of Mr Mears, the first Headmaster of the College, Miss Harris typed up the extracts about St Stithians that Monty had written in his airmail letters. These were first issued in 1969 (volume 1: 1953 – 1956) and a second volume (1957 – 1961) followed. Few extant copies remain. The Archives copy is a signed copy that formerly belonged to Lindsay Baytopp, the first groundsman after whom Baytopp field is named.

PHASE 1

The Pavillion will be built overlooking the current Wayne Joubert Field (directly below the Higher Ground). It will be built with increased change room facilities to help with the number of sporting events on the field as well as surrounding areas. It will also include a large open area which can be setup for catering for sports teams and supporters alike. The facility will provide viewing areas for the current Wayne Joubert Field and the newly envisaged field which will form part of Phase 2.

PHASE 2

The current 'sand' field adjacent to the Higher Ground Conference Room is an opportunity to grow the overall school resources. The plan is to grass, irrigate and light the current field to make way for various setups for different sports. This will include space for two football/rugby fields and a cricket pitch. The pitch in the current Baytopp field will be removed and relocated so as to create a dedicated 1st team rugby field at the school. This development will create more space for current school teams as well as Crusaders sports teams and at the same time remove some pressure on the current fields.

PHASE 3

The past few years has seen an increase in sporting codes offered on campus, many of which have the need for indoor facilities. This phase of the project will see the development of either the free space adjacent to the Higher Ground Conference Room or the current 'cabbage patch' field next to the pools. This facility will be able to host indoor hockey, netball and basketball for the learners as well as the Crusaders sporting codes. This facility will also be able to double up as a hall facility for the girls school.
