Introduction : The Old Stithian App forms an integral part of our Membership strategy and communications roadmap going forward. Your new App is positioned as a more consistent, more accessible and less intrusive communication tool, aiding involvement and correspondence within our membership base. This launch is also a major first for an African Old Girls / Old Boys organisation and sees us form part of a select-few similar Associations globally.

The OSA mobile application has been developed to keep Alumni in touch with what is happening at the Association as well as the school at all times. By making use of Digital Peppa's Event Peppa solution, the app allows Alumni to view event details, access sporting and cultural fixtures, see our latest news, contact any of the leaders with click-to-contact facilities, receive real-time messages and view our image and video galleries. We have also integrated the OSA Membership card into the application that will allow you to replace your traditional membership card as well as access restricted areas in the application. Chris Williams (1971), the Chair of Crusaders Flyfishing Club, was fishing a small almost dry stream recently in the Bushveld amongst wild animals in Northern Province. This is his 'fishing' story : "Could not find one fish, we need rain and lots of it as otherwise locals can't plant maize. Fish all moved downstream. All the action was on the shore, I was fishing amongst giraffe, wildebeest, impala, zebra, warthogs and bushbuck. My mate who was born/bred on the local farm was fishing with me and he only told me halfway through the fishing, the impala that remains by the river were from a lion kill the night before and the hyenas and jackals had taken the legs off for breakfast. If that wasn't scary enough, a long green snake came and curled up beside me on a rock. I thought it was a deadly Green Mamba or Boomslang, imagine my relief when my mate shouted 'DO NOT MOVE! Good news and bad news Chris! Bad news is it is the most aggressive snake in Africa, good news it's venom is pretty harmless.' At which point the four-foot snake reared its head at me and at which point I did a Usain Bolt.... luckily it was only what is called a Spotted Bush Snake. We also saw African Goliath Kingfishers, Fish Eagles, Great Butterflies and some amazing plants. As for the fishing, I can't quite remember!"

The first picture - a scene of tranquillity with me fishing on my ownsome before the snake snuck up on me from behind. The second picture after the snake and lion's feast incidents with an unexpected sign on route back to the farm just to add fuel to the fire! Mario, in the second photo, was born and raised in the area and looks suitable unfazed by it all... Sometimes you have to laugh and be grateful for life - not much else you can do!"
