Introduction : The Old Stithian App forms an integral part of our Membership strategy and communications roadmap going forward. Your new App is positioned as a more consistent, more accessible and less intrusive communication tool, aiding involvement and correspondence within our membership base. This launch is also a major first for an African Old Girls / Old Boys organisation and sees us form part of a select-few similar Associations globally.

The OSA mobile application has been developed to keep Alumni in touch with what is happening at the Association as well as the school at all times. By making use of Digital Peppa's Event Peppa solution, the app allows Alumni to view event details, access sporting and cultural fixtures, see our latest news, contact any of the leaders with click-to-contact facilities, receive real-time messages and view our image and video galleries. We have also integrated the OSA Membership card into the application that will allow you to replace your traditional membership card as well as access restricted areas in the application. Future versions of the app will allow members to make mobile payments, access advertising opportunities, showcase their products/services and much more!

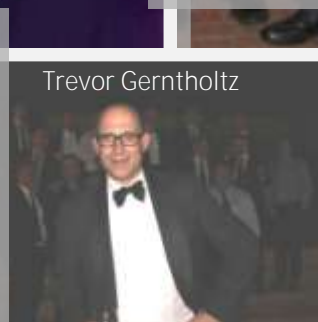

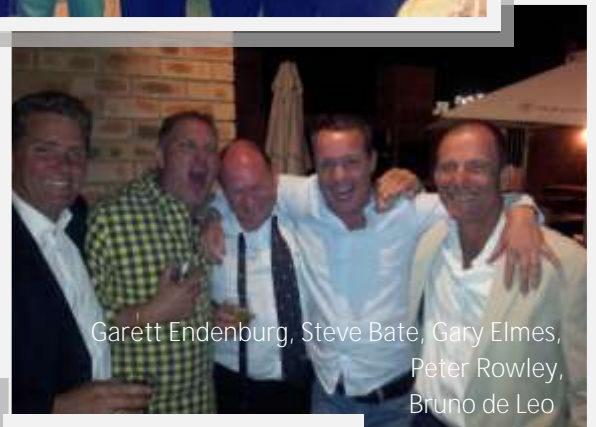

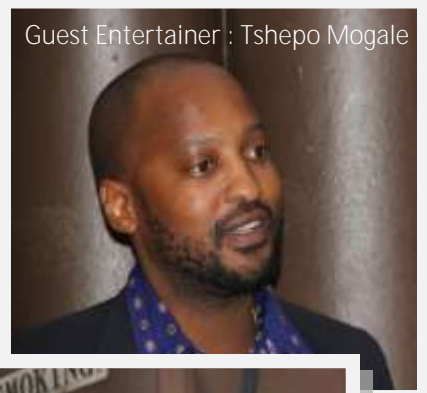

Crusaders Rugby

As part of a drive to increase the amount of networking and social activity in the Old Stithian Association, we have entered a team into [The 2015 Cape Town Tens](#) which will be held on the 6 and 7 February 2015, late Friday morning start until late Saturday night/very early Sunday morning finish. This is the **world's biggest rugby tournament, in terms of number of players**, and is a massively enjoyable event. It should definitely be on your bucket list! The team will consist of 20 players and 1 or 2 managers to look after the details of a travelling team. The playing team is made up of 5 forwards and 5 backs with 10 rolling subs. We will take part in the beer medium division for our 3rd year into the tournament. As part of the planning process, we will be looking for players firstly and most importantly, (cost for flights, accommodation, transport, etc. in 2014 was around R5,000 each - we try to get as much sponsored as possible and have secured R35,000 so far).

If there is anyone who would like to be sponsors, it would be much appreciated. This is to ensure the costs are kept to a minimum and encourage people to join us in playing for Crusaders the Old Stithian Association sports brand). The sponsorship opportunities include branding for your company on the two sleeves and the shorts of each of the players. There are 6 branding locations available at a rate of R10,000 per spot. There will also be opportunities on the team bags and special mailer of thanks to the OSA database. Your support will be most appreciated.

If you are interested, please send a mail with your name, surname, ID number, contact number, e-mail address, rugby CV (including position) and fitness level (including beer fitness and likelihood of heart attack!). This needs to be with us as soon as possible. If you know of anyone who would like to take part and is a decent rugby player who is part of the Saints family, (please forward onto your sons if email is not for you) please forward this mail to them as soon as possible.

Once we have received these details, we will make sure we fill each of the spots on the touring team and get back to you. Once you have confirmed your place, you will need to pay R1,000 deposit to secure your spot. If we get enough sponsors to cover all the cost, you will get your money back once you LAND in Cape Town, if not, this will be absorbed into the costs. You will also need to be available for a few practices throughout the year, however, this will not exclude you from the team if you are out of town.

Did you know?

Raymond Bruce Schoeman (1970) recently donated his Honours Blazer to the OSA. He attended St Stithians Boys College from 1962-1970 and was Collins House Border. He was the first scholar to get Honours twice for Cricket, Rugby and Athletics :

Honours for Cricket in 1969 (Tvl Nuffield) and 1970. He played 1st team cricket from the end of Gr 9 to Matric.

Honours for Rugby in in Gr 11 & 12, 1969 and 1970(Craven week player representing TVL).

Honours for Athletics in 1969 and 1970. He received a few gold medals during this time and also broke the school long jump record that had been held for about 18 years or so, and it stood strong for about 20 years before Robbie Diack came along and smashed it by 20cm.

Ray was also the first Saint scholar to receive Provincial recognition in Cricket and Rugby.

Confession after 50 years!

Recollection. A story with a sting in the tail.

The time is now right, and the world is ready for the truth to be laid bare. Until a decent interval, set by the participant as being 50 years, it was not appropriate to make this disclosure. Names and events had to be hidden to protect the guilty.

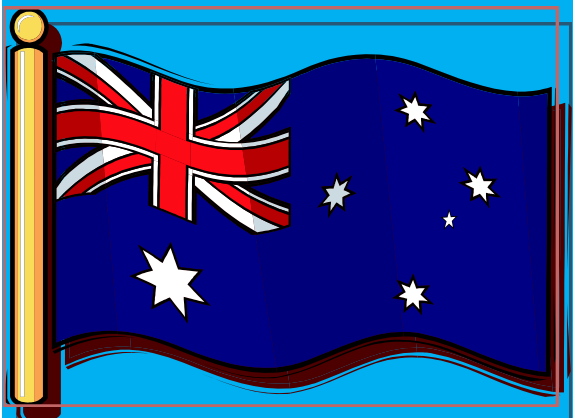

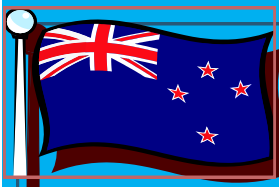

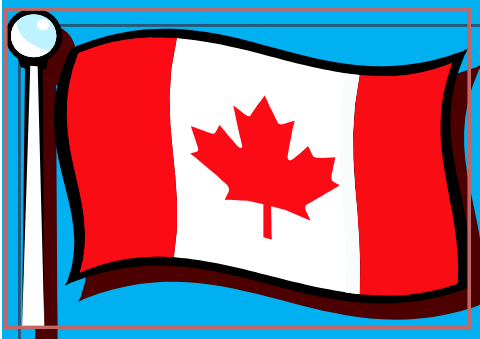

The Old Stithian Association has a proud history of contributing to the future of St Stithians College. Over the years, members of the Alumni, Parents and the Association have been involved in developing the College and its facilities to ensure we remain a world class facility.

In the past, Alumni and the OSA have been involved in the development of fields, lighting of fields, building of the HPC, donating funds for various projects around the campus and a number of bursaries to current and former pupils of our great school.

As the Association grows so we have been able to take on larger projects, the most recent being the building of our current home, The One and All facility which houses the Higher Ground Restaurant, The Warriner Pub, The Saints Lodge and a conference facility. All of these facilities have been open to the Saints community and have seen huge popularity for sporting events and private functions. Through the growth in these venues we have managed to grow further and we are now in a position to take on a much larger project.

The Higher Ground Development project includes 3 phases which will improve the area around the Higher Ground, increase the capacity for events and take the schools facilities to the next level.

All in all, this development project is envisaged to cost in the region of R7.5million to complete and will be funded through a number of channels. PHASE 1

THE PAVILLION

The Pavillion will be built overlooking the current Wayne Joubert Field (directly below the Higher Ground). It will be built with increased change room facilities to help with the number of sporting events on the field as well as surrounding areas. It will also include a large open area which can be setup for catering for sports teams and supporters alike. The facility will provide viewing areas for the current Wayne Joubert Field and the newly envisaged field which will form part of Phase 2.

PHASE 2

ADJACENT FIELD

The current 'sand' field adjacent to the Higher Ground Conference Room is an opportunity to grow the overall school resources. The plan is to grass, irrigate and light the current field to make way for various setups for different sports. This will include space for two football/rugby fields and a cricket pitch. The pitch in the current Baytopp field will be removed and relocated so as to create a dedicated 1st team rugby field at the school. This development will create more space for current school teams as well as Crusaders sports teams and at the same time remove some pressure on the current fields.

PHASE 3

INDOOR CENTRE

The past few years has seen an increase in sporting codes offered on campus, many of which have the need for indoor facilities. This phase of the project will see the development of either the free space adjacent to the Higher Ground Conference Room or the current 'cabbage patch' field next to the pools. This facility will be able to host indoor hockey, netball and basketball for the learners as well as the Crusaders sporting codes. This facility will also be able to double up as a hall facility for the girls school.

Letters of Mr E M (“Monty”) Harris - Order Form

“Monty” Harris was one of the first four staff members of St Stithians College in 1953. From the first few days of the College until April 1961, shortly before he died during a holiday visit to his sister Lilian in England, he recorded the early years of the development of the College in letters to Lilian. Following his death and at the request of Mr Mears, the first Headmaster of the College, Miss Harris typed up the extracts about St Stithians that Monty had written in his airmail letters. These were first issued in 1969 (volume 1: 1953 – 1956) and a second volume (1957 – 1961) followed. Few extant copies remain. The Archives copy is a signed copy that formerly belonged to Lindsay Baytopp, the first groundsman after whom Baytopp field is named. These booklets are being made available at R130-00 for the two volume set. Funds raised from this project will go towards the development of a Living History Museum in which the history of the College can be displayed and explored in both real and virtual formats.
