Rector's Concluding Remarks



Good morning One and All

As a College of seven schools, our need and capacity to embrace the current reality, and to begin to forge a different yet improved educational landscape, is highlighted by the *online* sharing of past Founders' Days - together with our planning for a possible *onsite* Founders' Day on the 1st August. Our ability to differentiate our responses as needs arise is – and has always been - one of our quintessential strengths.

We cannot simply yearn for what was: we need to think about what *can be*. In my last address to you I spoke about the importance of faith, hope, imagination and action in empowering us *to #Be Stronger one and All*. Recently, alumnus Matthew Charlesworth shared with me a philosophical paper by University of Notre Dame's Associate Professor Glen Morrison¹. In his reflection on the transformative power of education, Morrison writes about the importance of engaging our students in growing their souls, minds and hearts so that they develop "thinking hearts of hopeful intelligence".

This has resonated with me because, at SAINTS, we do more than deliver a curriculum. We educate the complete human being, shaping people who will impact society, 'Inspiring Excellence and Making a World of Difference. I also like Morrison's seven teaching attributes as they echo our Saints ethos. He urges us as educators to develop our students' thinking hearts by being: spontaneous; imaginative; hopeful; faithful; pastoral; courageous and nurturing - and vigilant. It is my belief that, as never before do we need thinking hearts of hopeful intelligence. As an educational community – and as a nation – we will rise into a differently imagined future.

As some of our students return to campus in the days and weeks ahead, the expectation of seeing and hearing their vibrancy again fills me with hope. As our country shifts from Lockdown Level 4 to 3, not only we at Saints, but all of us in South Africa, will need our actions to be informed by selfless thinking hearts and hopeful intelligence. We will remain vigilant as we courageously embrace a hopeful future. Our faith enables us to believe all shall be well.
