These programmes are focused on historically disadvantaged learners, student-teachers and teachers.

I am most grateful to our staff who have worked tirelessly over the last few weeks to ensure that our offering continues to be that which is synonymous with St Stithians: student-centered excellence. In due course, the Heads of schools will communicate details pertinent to their respective schools.
