Walking around the campus yesterday, there was a lovely sense of the energy that young people bring – the excited sounds of the new term expressed in the voices of boys and girls, the higher pitches of the little ones and the lower pitches and more measured conversations of the older ones. In the afternoon and evening, all our sports facilities were abuzz with activity, and sounds of music practice created layered ambience. We have jumped right in to Term 3, no hesitation. With our five schools back in session, I marvel at the opportunities of St Stithians and give thanks for the investment of our parents in a Saints education: Inspiring Excellence and Making a World of Difference.

On Monday, the staff of all the schools and departments gathered in chapel for Holy Communion. We listened in appreciation to our visiting preacher, Rev Nokulunga Songca, minister in the Fourways Circuit. Our Matrics enter their final season at St Stithians. It's a time a mixed emotion: ready to leave, there is the race of final exams to run. We push together towards the finishing line, and we mark this final lap with memorable moments of reflection and thanksgiving.
