#### Mandela 100

I write to you on the centenary of the birthday of Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela. It was my privilege to attend the 16<sup>th</sup> Nelson Mandela Annual Lecture at the Wanderers Stadium yesterday. The four main speakers – Njabulo Ndebele, Graça Machel, Cyril Ramaphosa and Barack Obama – highlighted the magnitude and significance of Mandela's legacy, nationally and globally.

Following on from our commemoration of the Mandela centenary during our Founders' Day Service, our schools have been actively preparing for <u>Mandela Day</u>. The intent to honour Mandela reinforces the core values of St Stithians as a school which educates active citizens who make a contribution and affirm human dignity. The College's M100 photograph symbolises our collective appreciation and recognition accorded to Nelson Mandela by the staff and students of St Stithians.

The iMadiba micro museum has been built, overlooking the Ridgway Field from the Girls' Prep side: we look forward to this symbolic replica of Nelson Mandela's Robben Island cell being an important place of gathering, reflection and conversation. Thank you to the Chair and Deputy Chair of Council, Carel Nolte and Ntombi Langa-Royds, and alumni donors for their generosity in funding the iMadiba project on our campus.

## Founders' Day 2018

# Tapestry of Inspiring Excellence, Making a World of Difference on the world stage

We can celebrate and reflect on three remarkable recent achievements on the world stage, associated with St Stithians. These highlight the diverse tapestry of inspiring excellence and making a world of difference. The choirs of our girls' schools achieved three gold medals in the recent World Choir Games held in Pretoria. Kevin Anderson (Old Stithian, 2003) reached the finals of the Wimbledon Tennis Championship after two epic matches in the quarter-finals and semi-finals; joining fellow South Africans Raven Klaasen and Kgothatso Montjane in their tennis successes.
