### Reaching the end of a long term

I express thanks and appreciation to all in the great Saints team – students, staff and parents – for your dedication, contribution, service and achievements. There is so much to celebrate in the rich tapestry of a St Stithians education, and we have expressed this is full flight this past term. It has been a long haul and we are now at the end of it!

The term dates for 2019 were decided on in 2017. At that time, the College Executive recognized that the lateness of Easter in the annual calendar created a challenge for the length of Term 1. We took the inprinciple decision to stay 'in term' up to the Easter weekend and to create two half-terms. The placing of Easter has resulted in a short April holiday and we have planned a longer than usual August holiday.

# The significance of Easter

Alongside the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas, the commemoration of the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter marks the second major moment in the Christian calendar. As a Methodist Church School, we commit to a special focus on the Easter message of God's profound and sacrificial love for humanity; the offer of forgiveness and wholeness which flow from repentance and renewal; the triumph of good over evil; the affirmation of life and living over death and dying. Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross and then resurrection from the dead inspires and motivates Christians to live out their faith with humility, gratitude and service as agents of God's love in our world – our school, neighbourhood, city, country, continent and globe.
